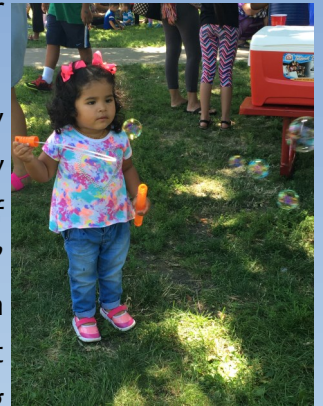
Child Abuse Prevention Month Highlights



Every April agencies and individuals across the nation highlight the importance of preventing Child Abuse. Child abuse is an issue that does not discriminate based on race, religion, or socio-economic class. While it is important to recognize the impact of abuse, at Child Abuse Prevention Services we try to equip parents and children with the tools and knowledge they need to prevent abuse before it happens.
