What We Achieved



Home Visitation Programs

3,592

Home visits completed

477

Children served

99% of families enrolled in a home visiting program reported an improvement in family interactions

97% of families enrolled in a home visiting program reported knowing where to get help in the community

98% of parents in Building Healthy Families reported reading more to their child

100% of families in Refugee Health Connections reported their knowledge of child development has increased



Crisis Service Programs

100% of families enrolled in crisis services reported knowing where to get help in the community

100% of families enrolled in crisis services reported a decrease in stress as a result of their participation

100% of families enrolled in crisis services rated their experience with the program as excellent or very good

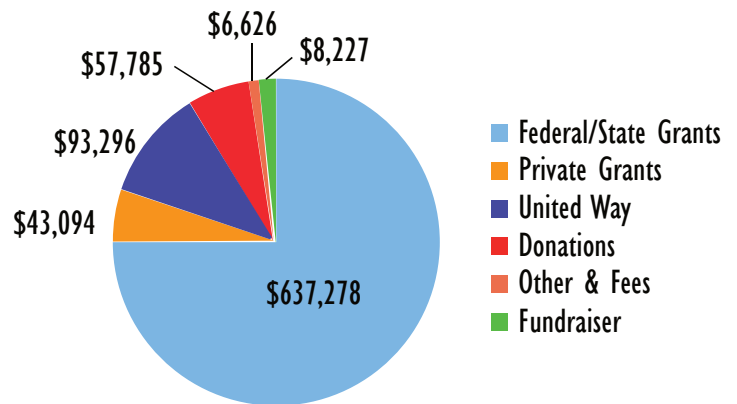

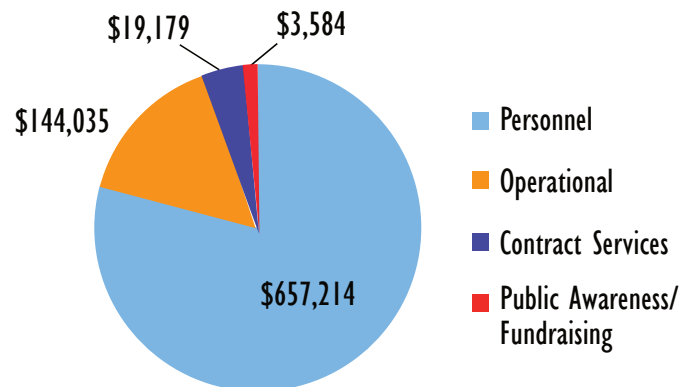
